Showcasing and Safekeeping the New Gallery's Precious Artifacts

The Museum's new Island Heritage Gallery will feature state-of-the-art exhibit cases manufactured in Germany and California. These cases provide the framework for displaying-and protecting-a wide range of exceptional artifacts from our collections, some of which are being exhibited for the first time.

In order to showcase these artifacts as they deserve, the Museum has stepped up to an even higher level of quality in the mounts being created for the artifacts. We were extremely fortunate to secure the services and talents of professional mount maker David Kiyabu. He is quite simply the best in the State, previously employed by the Bishop Museum for more than 12 years creating artifact mounts for their Hawaiian Hall and Pacific Hall, among many other exhibits. During those years David collaborated with the best conservator in Hawai'i, Linda Hee ... and since she too has joined the Museum's Gallery team as our project conservator, we are indeed lucky to have two such top-of-the-line professionals overseeing the presentation and protection of the artifacts on exhibit. In the next issue of *The Journal* we plan to highlight the conservation work Linda is carrying out for the project.

David is so talented that his custom, hand-crafted mounts are barely visible, so the artifact is displayed to its best advantage with a minimum of distraction from supporting hardware. One reason for investing the extra time and effort in making custom mounts is the safeguarding of artifacts on display. His method includes the highest museum standards and conservation practices ranging from the use of stainless steel and brass mounts, specialized cones that support artifacts mounted to the back walls or floor decks of the cases, appropriate paint, and other museum-grade conservation materials. The work David performs combines the skill of a welder, the creativity of an artist, a knowledge of museum practices and standards for all aspects of exhibition, and the desire to ensure that the artifacts-and not the mounts-are the focus of any display.

David lives on O'ahu and will be traveling between Honolulu and Hilo to work at the Museum every week, Monday through Thursday, for the next several months. His accommodations here are generously supported by Museum Trustees Andrew Wilson and Richard Henderson. He seems to be adjusting well both to the sounds of coqui at night and the much lighter traffic of Hilo!
